# President's Message August 2024

**MOVIE FUND RAISER** – On July 20th, the Friends sponsored a Saturday morning at the movies fund raiser event. We sold over 100 tickets to Despicable Me 4 and generated in excess of \$700 to help the library. We thank Julie Gervais and Nani Banks for making this happen and we thank Ridgecrest Cinemas for generously allowing us to keep all ticket revenues plus a percentage of their concession stand sales.

**TOTALLY TABLES FUNDRAISER** – The Friends were selected by the Rotary Club of China Lake as their non-profit organization to support at this year's event, Totally Tables to be held on September 14<sup>th</sup> at the Springhill Suites Conference Center. This event features a yummy catered dinner, an auction of 10 special items and a 50/50 drawing. Tables are encouraged to select a theme and decorate their table accordingly. Price is \$85.00 per person, of which \$50.00 is a tax deductible donation. If you are interested in buying a table for eight, please contact Betty Miller at 760-382-8295. **BOOK FACILITY** -- We continue to search for an affordable facility that meets our requirements. Board Member John Freeman and I recently met with Cody Criswell, assistant to Kern County Supervisor for District 1 Phillip Peters, to request their assistance in finding a new facility. We continue to pursue a great possibility that would meet our requirement for a storefront in which we can sort, display and sell books. We hope to gain access to this space by the end of the year and begin selling books on a weekly basis. This would allow us to resume accepting limited book donations. We also continue to search for an affordable storage space. Again, if any of you are aware of possible facilities, please let us know.

**ONLINE BOOK SALES** – To supplement our local book sales, we are investigating multiple options to sell books online. This approach offers several advantages – a much broader buyer pool, 365 days a year to sell, and an alternative outlet in case we cannot find a suitable storefront. We have had discussions with candidate book vendors and plan to finalize our approach at our August Board meeting.

**DONATIONS** -- As you know, most of the funds that we use to support the library come from book sales and donations. Starting with the last newsletter, we added a new section honoring major donors. Hopefully, this section will remind us all to make a donation to the Friends. By the way, if you wish to donate now, please send a check or log onto our website (<u>Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library</u> (<u>ridgecrestfriends.org</u>) to donate via credit card, debit card or bank transfer.

**LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES** – With assistance from volunteer Gary Arnold, we installed a LFL in Pearson Park. Board member Nancy Saxton will serve as steward for this LFL, which was relocated from Inyokern. The previously vandalized LFL located near the DART Thrift Store on Gold Canyon has been repaired and restocked with books. If anyone is interested in helping to repair and *[continued on page 3]*

An incredibly busy summer at the Ridgecrest Branch Library is coming to a close soon, along with our Summer Reading Challenge (official end date of 7/31 but we will let people pick up finisher bags and choose finisher books until the end of the day on Saturday, August 10). We hope YOU have been logging books read or listened to so we can add them to our finisher numbers. (If not this summer, we hope you can help us next summer.) We want to briefly mention the following generous sponsors who have donated Summer Reading Challenge prizes or funds for prizes: Conveying Awareness with Jessica David, Ridgecrest Lions Club, Ridgecrest Pizza Factory, Ridgecrest Toys for Tots, Ridgecrest United Methodist Church, Roadrunner Ridge Community Foundation, and Schu Fu Martial Arts Dojo #119.

LUNCH AT THE LIBRARY returned for part of the summer, thanks to our food partner Sierra Sands Unified School District (since 2018). Lunch was offered at no cost to ALL children 18 and under from 6/6-7/12. This summer, we served 1,672 lunches to children in 20 days. Every Friday, we had princesses from Sierra Academy of Dance read to families and offer children tattoos or stickers. We had other visitors during Lunch at the Library including Waste Management with a recycling truck, CERT, RidgeWriters, Children's Burn Foundation, Liberty Ambulance with hands only CPR, Ridgecrest Fire Department Station 84, Navy Federal Credit Union, and PACT Child ID. Thanks to a generous Lunch at the Library grant, we were able to offer all children a book to build their home library EVERY DAY THAT WE SERVED LUNCH! We also received some prize donations for a weekly attendance drawing along with larger prizes (from Ridgecrest Toys for Tots) for both attending and for filling out a survey. [pictures on page 4]

We have a collection box for plastic bags and plastic wrap through mid-Feb 2025 to help the Ridgecrest Lions Club collect 1,000 lbs. of plastic to place a bench near the veterans memorial park at the Sgt. John Pinney Pool Complex. Drop off CLEAN plastic bags and overwrap any time the library is open (Tue-Thu 10 am to 7 pm, Fri 10 am to 6 pm, and Sat 10 am to 4 pm). Save your grocery bags, produce bags, newspaper bags, plastic overwrap on cases of bottled water/paper towels/toilet paper, shipping envelopes, bubble wrap, air pillows, and bread/tortilla bags (please empty crumbs first). You might have noticed that some other library branches are closed (or will be closing soon) temporarily for their infrastructure grant updates. We have not received any updates on when it will be our turn or all of the specific projects that we will have done to improve our branch, so stay tuned for updates.
