President's Message November 2024

TOTALLY TABLES FUNDRAISER – The Friends were fortunate to be selected by the Rotary Club of China Lake as their non-profit organization to support at this year's event, Totally Tables. This event was held on September 14th at the Springhill Suites Conference Center and featured a yummy catered dinner, beautifully decorated tables, a bucket auction of donated items, and a 50/50 raffle. There were 11 tables, 2 of which were sponsored by Friends supporters, including the Ridge Writers Board. Although we do not have an exact total, it appears the Friends will receive a donation of approximately \$6500.00! This is one of our most successful fundraisers to date. We thank Rotary and Betty Miller for making this happen.

BOOK SALE – The Fall book sale will be held November 2nd and 3rd. As something new, members will receive coupons to reduce the cost of their purchases. There is more information on page 5 in this newsletter, and flyers will be posted on Facebook and our Web Page. See you all at the sale!

BOOK FACILITY -- We continue to search for an affordable facility that meets our requirements. Board Member John Freeman and I are working to schedule a follow up meeting with Cody Criswell, assistant to Kern County 1st District Supervisor Phillip Peters, to review possible County options for a new facility. We are still pursuing a great possibility that would meet our requirement for a storefront in which we can sort, display and sell books but have not made any further progress. Again, if any of you are aware of possible facilities, please let us know.

DONATIONS -- As you know, most of the funds that we use to support the library come from book sales and donations. We are now honoring major donors in each newsletter. (Obviously, we added the Rotary Club of China Lake to the list!) Hopefully, this section will remind us to make a donation to the Friends. LITTLE FREE LIBRARIES – The Friends currently support three Little Free Libraries (LFLs) in Ridgecrest by supplying books and repairing damage by vandals. Sadly, all three LFLs were vandalized since the last newsletter. Vandals tore off the doors from all three. Two doors were so badly damaged that they needed to be replaced. Thanks to Board Member Nancy Saxton's son for rebuilding the door to LFL in Pearson Park. One LFL will be relocated to a (hopefully) safer site. Can you believe that we are coming up on the end of 2024 in a couple short months?!? While there

are some lovely graphics being included to showcase our summer *Lunch at the Library* visitors along with *Summer Reading Challenge* finisher numbers, prize sponsors, and program sponsors, I wanted to make a couple of points. Our 270 book finishers read or listened to 7,966 books and our 60 hours finishers read or listened to 86,027 minutes (or 1,433 hours)!

If you didn't help us with our numbers for this past summer, I'd love for you to consider helping us for next summer. Branch staff are happy to log the books or hours for you as long as we know what you read or listened to (you can even give us your due date receipts when you are done).

This summer was filled with big performances: Omnipresent Puppet Theater (sponsored by RidgeWriters), The Magic of Josiah (sponsored by Friends of the Kern County Library, Inc.), Michael Albert Pop Art Experience (sponsored by Friends of the Ridgecrest Branch Library), Magic

I also want to thank the generosity of our Summer Reading Challenge prize sponsors, who provided 12 items, 86 gift cards, 3 cake decorating classes from Mamma Mia's Cupcakes and Treats, and 66 boxes of Girl Scout Cookies to our bonus finisher winners (with some finishers winning Girl Scout cookies) along with Pizza Factory, who provided 253 mini pizza and drink coupons for all child and teen finisher bags! We also had some incredibly generous donations from our branch Amazon Wish List that funded a lot of our summer programs involving craft supplies.

We had a temporary closure during the first week of October to get some HVAC work done as part of the Building Forward Library Facilities Infrastructure Grant from the CA State Library. There is still more work to come in 2025 for our branch, so stay tuned to see what work we will be getting next. We HOPEFULLY will not be temporarily closed for future [cont.p.4]

Closures: here are the upcoming closures for the next few months. In November, we will be closed for Thanksgiving (Thu 11/28, Fri 11/29, and Sat 11/30). In December, we will be closed on Fri 12/6 for our annual All Staff Training Day, along with Tue 12/24, Wed 12/25, Thu 12/26, Fri 12/27, Sat 12/28, and Tue 12/31 for Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Winter Recess, and New Year's Eve. We will also be closed on Wed 1/1. Due dates and hold expiration dates will be shifted until after the new year, and, of course, the book drops will still be emptied.

We have shifted to a new format for providing programming information and instead of a calendar, which was color coded by age group but was getting cluttered due to the MANY programs we offer for all ages, we are offering age group targeted brochures. We have one for Early Learners (0-5 years old), Kids (6-11 years old), Teen (13-18 years old), and Adults (18+). This means that adults who are only interested in adult programming will be able to look through a brochure that showcases anything they can attend, instead of having to pore over the monthly calendar.





As usual, we have a full calendar in November and December. Two programs in November that you might want to participate in: our annual Thank-A-Veteran program, where we collect coloring pages, thank you cards, and letters for local veterans and Thanksgiving Cards for Seniors, where we help a local moms group (MAEVE Ridgecrest) collect Thanksgiving cards for local seniors at High Desert Haven and Bella Serra. (Please note that we also help MAEVE Ridgecrest collect Easter cards, and they usually alternate which location receives the cards each year. If they have enough for both locations, they will deliver to both locations.)

As the season of being thankful and reflecting on the past year draws closer, I would like to thank all of you for everything that you do to support the Ridgecrest Branch Library in whatever capacity you can! We truly appreciate all of the support we get from our wonderful community that helps us offer the many things that we do for our community. If you have any ideas for future programs, feel free to let us know. We exist because of our community, and we try to provide what our community wants.

Are you ready for the Fall Book Sale? We have MANY, MANY books for sale that you have not seen. The China Lake Museum donated boxes of books on military history, world history, politics and biographies. We also received an estate donation: 100+ Louis L'Amour collectible paperback westerns in near-new condition; the entire Hank Mitchum Stagecoach collection of 52 books; a super collection of hardback books (last 6+ years) by King, Patterson, Cussler, Grisham, Griffith, Clancy, Roberts and other popular authors in near-new condition. We have at least 20 boxes of science fiction and paranormal books that have not been out for sale yet. We are attempting to get all of our fiction out on tables for this sale. Many of our regular non-fiction books are labeled BARGAIN 25¢ especially in the categories of science, math, legal/law, literature/writing, and computers. This book sale has something for everyone!
